3 - Four O'clock

1997. Produced by Cinevic. Directed by Mark Miller.

3 min. 7 sec. Black and white print in good shape.

A young man sits on the street begging and watches a woman pass by every day at 4 o'clock. Each day he secretly falls more in love with her. One day he receives one hundred dollars from a passerby. He decides to clean himself up, buy his crush a flower and give it to her. He awaits her arrival (at four o'clock) with a single rose only to be heart broken as she smiles into the arms of a waiting lover.
